The most desirable Dushan jade is characterized by a pure, even color, a fine and compact texture, good transparency, and minimal inclusions. The traditional grading system for Dushan jade classifies the material into "old pit material" (the highest grade from ancient mining sites), "new pit material" (from recently discovered mining sites), and lower grades based on color, texture, and clarity. However, the grading of Dushan jade is complex, as the value of a piece is also influenced by factors such as the skill of the carver, the complexity of the design, and the cultural or historical significance of the carving.
