Jean-Jacques Rousseau (1712-1778) had the political notion of the social contract established by citizens and leaders. 13. Edmund Burke (1729-1797) believed in the constitutional government. 14. Jeremy Bentham (1748-1832) came up with the government interest concept. 15. Henri de Saint-Simon (1760-1825), a French political, had the political view about the communism. 16. Georg Wilhelm Friedrich Hegel (1770-1831) represented the notion of nationalism. 17. John Stuart Mill (1806-1873) was a pro- utilita-

rianism. 18. Karl Marx (1818-1883) had a political view on the notion of communism. 19. Vladimir Lenin (1883-1924) also had a political view on the communism concept. 20. Benito Mussolini (1883-1945) was a man with a far-right politics view.
